KEEPING PEOPLE SAFE



South West Devon is an incredibly safe place to live. However, local survey responses and emails from constituents in recent months have highlighted to Rebecca and her team that there are some neighbourhoods where there remain concerns about antisocial behaviour (ASB).

In response to this feedback, Rebecca has met with the Police and Crime Commissioner, Alison Hernandez and with the Neighbourhood Policing team to discuss work that is already taking place in communities like lyybrldge to tackle ASB. Rebecca is also working with the Plymouth Community Safety team to secure CCTV on a key cycle path in Plymstock to deter ongoing ASB and reassure residents.
